THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST—CORPUS CHRISTI

Every time Mass is celebrated, a miracle is performed right before our eyes! The host is transformed into real flesh and the wine into real blood. While faith in what we do not see is essential, sometimes we need a little help. So here is a story that might do just that...

One Sunday in 1263, a German priest, Peter of Prague, was celebrating Mass above the tomb of St. Christina in the town of Bolsena, Italy. When he raised the host, blood started to trickle over his hands and onto the altar. A year later, after investigation and authentication, the miracle was confirmed, and it moved Pope Urban IV to institute the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. The white, blood-stained linen corporal cloth can still be seen in the Orvieto Cathedral north of Rome.

Today, as we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, let us thank Jesus for this great and wonderful gift—His Body and His Blood. Let us keep our eyes and our hearts open as we witness the Eucharistic miracle take place on the altar of our own churches!

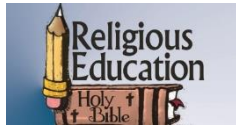
