



TODAY'S GOSPEL REFLECTION— **Second Sunday of Lent**



In last week's Gospel, we followed Jesus into the desert where He fasted and prayed. This week, He leads us up a

mountain to witness His Transfiguration. Why these experiences? Because He is preparing us to go with Him in a few short weeks to a hilltop, Golgotha, where He will lay down His life for our sake – and finally He will take us to an empty cave where He triumphed over sin and death once and for all.

Jesus perfectly understands our humanity. He knows we need to experience times of self-denial and testing, in order to arrive at mountain-top moments when we see and feel His glorious presence in our lives. Stations for the Suffering & III

Based on the Traditional Stations of the Cross, this version focuses on strengthening Christians who are sick or struggling while uniting their sufferings to Christ's. The Stations of the Cross for the Suffering and Ill are a moving and prayerful experience for everybody at all stages of life.

March 28 - 6:30 PM **Traditional**

A devotional prayer consisting of 14 steps details the last stages of Jesus' passion and death. Catholic-Christians prayerfully unite themselves with these events during the season of Lent, remembering that they were baptized into the Lord's passion, death, and Resurrection.

April 4 - 6:30 PM

Not My Will, But Yours Be Done Stations

A musical and candlelit version of the Stations of the Cross with Biblical excerpts. The Stations of the Cross prayed like never before will stir the hearts of the faithful as they respond with an excerpt from the Book of Psalms.

April 11 - 6:30 PM (Pierogies 'n Prayer) Praying the Stations with Mary

ADORATION

Have you ever been to Adoration?

Adoration is a special way to pray to Jesus in the Eucharist. During Adoration, a priest will place



the Eucharist in a monstrance—a beautiful vessel that holds the Host. It is a beautiful opportunity to step away from our noisy, busy lives and simply be with Jesus.

Many people encounter Jesus for the first time in their lives

in Adoration. This is where they have their first deeply personal experience of Jesus. They may have heard about Jesus their whole lives, they may have been receiving Jesus in the Eucharist every Sunday, but there is something about the experience of Jesus in Adoration that leads people to know Him. This shift from knowing about Jesus to knowing Jesus changes everything.

And once they are awakened in this way, the Holy Spirit leads them to live their faith and participate in all types of ministries. Imagine what might happen if you made an effort to spend time in Adoration this Lent?

Many parishes have Adoration once a month, once a week, or even every day. As a matter of fact, there is a Perpetual Adoration Chapel at St. Andrew Parish here in Johnstown!

Give yourself the chance to spend time in the presence of Jesus and your life will be transformed. It's simple. It's beautiful. And it works!

Saint Clement Church Finance Council Meeting Thursday, February 27, 2025

Members in attendance: Father Rosenbaum, Ralph Trofino, John Saracena, Pete Hohrun, Bill Riner, Diane Lopez, Laurie Sonoski, and Susan Stem.

We opened the meeting with a prayer.

We welcomed Laurie Sonoski to the group. She will be representing the Parish Council.

Budget and Finance Committee: John reported on the Financial Statements for the period through January 31, 2025. We continue to see a decrease in our revenue while still incurring expenses for the upkeep of the parish and school property.

Planning and Development Committee: The rental agreement with Soaring Heights is going well. It is a financial benefit because the income received is helping to offset some expenses. They are looking to install a new locking system. There is a potential interested party looking to rent the Adult Ed Center.

Facilities and Maintenance Committee: The rectory furnace has been completed. The school roof has also been replaced. There is a minor condensation issue in the school library, which will be resolved when the weather breaks. We are looking to coat and paint new lines on the parking lot. The Adult Ed Center's boiler passed inspection. There are some bricks on the school wall that are falling and will need replaced.

Fundraisers:

- Volunteers will be getting together on Friday the 28th to make Haluski for the upcoming sale. There will also be a Potato Soup sale during Lent. Apple Pies will be sold after mass this weekend.
- The Gas 'n Cash Fundraiser was a great success. Thank you to all who sold or purchased tickets.

New Business:

- John Concannon and team are looking for ways for individuals who watch Mass on YouTube to be able to donate online to the parish. It appears that PayPal may be the most inexpensive way to collect those donations. It was recommended that a clip be added at the end of each video with details on how to make donations. Susan suggested having the option of accepting credit card payments. More research will follow.
- Father mentioned about the Jubilee 2025. We are looking into the possibility of providing transportation to the churches on the Passports. This would be a wonderful way to see and experience the different churches in other areas (ex. State College), especially for those individuals who prefer not to drive themselves.
- Mark your calendars for Saturday, April 5th for a full day of Hope and Renewal with the parish family and special guest speaker and musician, Taylor Tripodi. Taylor will also give a concert that evening.
- The Valentine's Day Mass for parish widows/widowers was wonderful. Thank you to Ruth Morello, Nancy Stamplis, Julie Wagner and the team for coordinating such a nice event.

The next meeting will be held on Thursday, August 28th at 6:00 PM.

The meeting was closed with a prayer.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:25 pm.
