TODAY'S GOSPEL REFLECTION-

29TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The four pillars of parish stewardship are hospitality, prayer, formation, and service. They are intentionally presented in this order, with the idea that we cannot expect people to respond to calls to increase their prayer life, their formation, and their service within and outside the parish, if they do not first feel welcomed and valued through the warmth of hospitality. It just makes good sense. However, those who are already well-versed in the spirituality and practicalities of stewardship know well that stewardship cannot succeed unless it is steeped in prayer. Today's readings show us the immense value of prayer and the privileged place it must have in our individual lives and in our parish community. Our job, as Christian stewards, is simply to remain faithful to our relationship with God through prayer. We should prioritize the Scriptures as a source of prayer, and we must lean on each other in our communities – family and parish – as we support each other in prayer. A strong pillar of prayer will make all our other stewardship efforts fruitful.

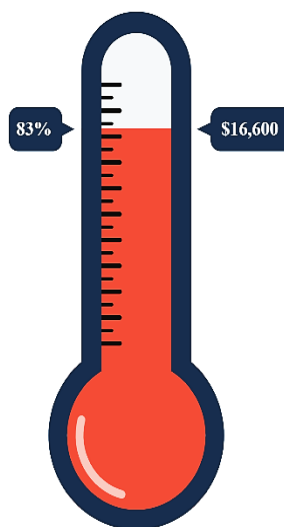


GOAL: \$20,000

ST. JUDE TRIDUUM

Our Annual Triduum to Saint Jude, patron of those in despair or in hopeless situations, will be held on **Tuesday, October 28th, Wednesday, October 29th and Thursday, October 30th**, with Masses being celebrated at **6:30 PM** each evening.

In addition to the Triduum Mass on **Wednesday, October 29th at 6:30 PM**, we will celebrate:

THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

You are a worthy candidate to receive the sacrament if you are of “advanced age,” are dealing with a serious disease or injury, or are burdened with a chronic illness. Any question should be decided in favor of receiving the sacrament. It is important to note the difference between the *Sacrament of the Sick* and *Extreme Unction*. *Extreme Unction* (Last Rites) is related to the spiritual healing in the face of death. The *Sacrament of the Sick* has two purposes: spiritual healing, and the real hope of physical healing and consolation. It makes tangible in liturgical actions the comfort and consolation of Christ and the prayer of the church intervening on behalf of the infirm or aging. Those not being anointed are encouraged to attend the liturgy in solidarity and prayerful support of those receiving the sacrament

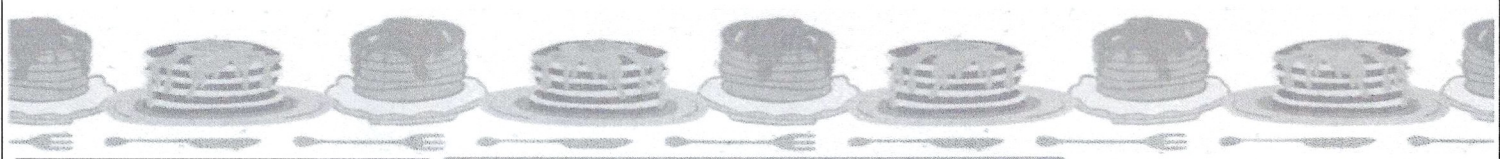

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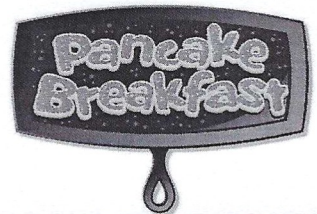
